PRESIDENT'S REPORT

We have reached the end of another year and it has become time to reflect on the year passed and to put forward where as a district we are going in the upcoming year. It has been a hard year for Central finding funding to keep all our programs in place. This year we have only been able to gain half the amount of funding we did last year and this has restricted what as a District we have been able to achieve and has meant that we have spent the year in a holding pattern rather than moving forward. While we have had some success with funding coming in that has kept all our school base programs running along with the National events and the Micro courts we have found the need to increase the user pays levy for teams. We were unable to find any funding through out the year to have a full or part time District coach, although we are in talks with Sport Taranaki to fund a coach force coach for squash and if the funding package is approved we will have a full time coach based at Sport Taranaki next year. As a board we still think this is the way forward. Central has four Micro-courts operating around the district with two of the courts heavily booked throughout the year and the other two unutilized. Central still has some of the highest booking rates for the micro-courts into schools in New Zealand. With the J grade operating throughout the district we can now see the number of juniors we have and over the year have had a big increase in numbers to the point where we have maintained the second highest number of junior players in New Zealand. Tournament player numbers have remained at the same level during the year but with clubs looking at their tournaments there has been a drop off in the number of tournaments been cancelled.

Overall the District has still maintained a high profile again this year with the New Zealand Nationals Tournament been held at Squash Palmerston using the all glass court and having the finals shown live on TV. The Central Open held at Kawaroa Park had an international field with the PSA and WIPSA rounds been run in conjunction, along with a number of New Zealand National events. My congratulations to the clubs that ran these events, the standard of organization is very high and I have heard nothing but praise on the professional attitude toward the running of the events.

Central has had a good year at the representative level although we find ourselves still in the rebuilding stage with the junior teams and this shows with the results but both teams finished as seeded. As the juniors have moved through to the seniors we are having good performance which saw the senior men finish third and women's finishing second. Well done to all players and management involve. As well a special congratulation to Amanda Cranston on her selection for New Zealand junior Girls team to China.

Sponsorship is still one of the biggest parts of the boards push again this year. Looking for new and maintaining old sponsors has been paramount. We had success with inspire net sponsoring the elite squads, Finance Point the A grade road show squash series although we lost Bonita our



corporate sponsor and team name, we will be working very hard to find a new naming sponsor. Prince carried

on with their Sponsorships of the senior Players series and the junior players series, both of these series have been very strongly supported by the players throughout the district and will be run again next year.

We gained funding through Lion Foundation for the running of the Primary and secondary school programs. We have maintained funding from Sports Taranaki to promote the sport in Taranaki clubs over the next couple of years. Through the NZ Community Trust (Pub Charity) we covered the cost of the District teams. NZ community trusts has been a big supply of funding throughout the years but this funding has been very hard to get this year, with more been declined than granted. We are hoping for a better year ahead, this year has been trying with almost a 50% cut in funding.

For the upcoming year there will be a year of change and challenges with Squash New Zealand changing the way that they operate the amount of funding the District gains and how to get the best value for the dollar spent. How and what programs are to be trimmed or dropped, gaining the required funding from the various Charity's to maintain the programs we deem to be of value. With the declining pool of money been made available next year will be a trying year for the Board. Clubs are still going to have to play a big part in these changes, as they are the stake holders if we do not get the support from the clubs we will find it impossible to operate and make some of the programs work. The next step forward is to work with Sport Taranaki in filling the district coach position to give us the required results and outcomes.

To the Board of directors, their management teams that support them, Sharon Patterson the district administrator and Donna Wilson the SDO my thanks to you all for a great job well done. A special thanks to Jane who stepped in mid year after the resignation of the finance Director. This year has run well and your efforts have made my job very easy and a pleasure even under the extremes of conditions. To the Director that is standing down, Paula, I wish you all the best in the paths you chose in the future and hope that you prosper from your choices.

FINANCE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Well what big boots I have to fill. Having taken over the role as finance director in April 2007, it has been a huge learning curve for me.

Funding has been a big issue this year with actual funding received of \$40,508 falling a long way short of the previous year's amounts (\$93,874) & the 2007 budgeted figure (\$90,000). Sharon Patterson continues to work tirelessly in this area to secure as much funding as is possible for the district. Funding is becoming more difficult to secure and it will certainly have an impact on how we run the district in future years. A big thanks to all the trusts who continue to support us

As touched on in last years report, the SNZ contribution is now based on SEM numbers and therefore the funding levels have dropped to \$17,000 this year compared with \$25,000 in previous years. To keep this contribution at this level the clubs and district will have to work hard to retain (and hopefully increase) the current SEM numbers.

Sport Taranaki and Sport Manawatu continue to support us through the regional development funding and coaches count programs. Going forward continuance of these programs in the present form is an unknown although we are looking at a new initiative for 2008 with the coach force coach program through Sport Taranaki.

At the time of writing it is still unknown whether our long time sponsor Bonita will be renewing the sponsorship for 2008 and beyond.

Prince continues to support the players' series which has run this year at a small surplus. It certainly continues to be popular amongst the regions players.

Inspire net has come on board this year with \$5000 sponsorship primarily for the zone coaches and Elite squad, initially for a 2 year period with the goal to increase the numbers from our district in the National squads.

We welcome also another new sponsor Finance Point, who has offered sponsorship for the newly named Finance Point series for the top players around the region.

A special mention to Paula Darlington, our marketing director who has done a fabulous job working to bring the new sponsors on board, and also working with the existing sponsors to ensure they are looked after. She is stepping down this year to start a family & we all wish her well.



Income has dropped by more than 20% this year, due mainly to the decrease in funding received. Interclub fees have remained steady which is positive as many clubs are experiencing a drop in

numbers playing competitive squash. Affiliation fees have increased this year due to the levy increase at the beginning of this year, the actual SEM numbers remain reasonably stable.

We have had to raise the rep player's contribution this year also to \$100 per person (\$50 previously)

Cash expenses have decreased by 26% in 2007 mostly because the fulltime coaching position did not continue. Rep team costs continue to be high and the micro court costs have increased during the year, even though the Wanganui micro court has not been used much during the year.

Overall we have made a deficit of \$2,974, (2007 surplus \$3132) which is a reasonable result given the large decrease in funding received as mentioned earlier.

At year end our cash position is healthy with reserves of \$33,511, however we have cashed in our \$5,000 investment with the TSB upon maturity. The reserves will only just cover our expenses over the off season.

Collection of monies owing to us is often a slow process and this year is no exception with debtors being at their highest level for 3 years. However included in the outstanding figure of \$13,741 is an amount of \$2,450 which is an outstanding insurance claim for the stolen computer in the 2006 year. We are still waiting on the insurance company for that money.

The 2008 year will be a challenging one for Central Squash. With the tight funding environment we are unsure how much funding we will be receive and this will affect the bottom line adversely if it continues to decrease.

We have increased 2008 affiliation fees by 2% which is less than \$1 per SEM. This increase along with some successful funding applications will help to keep the district heading in the right direction next year.

Thank you also to the rest of the 2007 board members who have welcomed me with open arms. It is always difficult first time around but in the short while I have been doing this job, I have certainly developed a greater understanding of how Central Squash operates.

Seniors

The annual triangular held in Masterton was the first representative fixture for the year, where Central finished 2nd behind BOP but still winning the trophy against Wellington who finished 3rd.

Throughout the year there was a number of training camps held (thanks to Karl Fraser and Grant Watts for organising them.) which were useful in getting us prepared for Nationals and good bonding sessions for the team as well as mixing with the juniors.

Senior Nationals was held in Palmerston North which was good for us as we were obviously very familiar with the courts. Everyone had to play two games on the first day which is quite an effort. Josh Greenfield seeded 4th and Amanda Cranston seeded 6th were our main hopes of wining a National title. After the first round we were down to 5 players left in the main draw and by the end of the day Josh, Amanda and Jackie were though to the quarter finals.

Saturday saw a few sore bodies but everyone pick themselves up for possibly another couple of games. Josh was the only one to win in the morning out of the 3 that were left which meant he had a semi-final against Kashif on the all glass court.

Sunday saw Josh playing for 3rd/4th which he won against Martin Knight. Amanda playing Lisa Cowlard for 5th/6th which she lost in a tight 5 setter, and Paul Tuffin in the plate final where he demolished Grant Craig. That night there was the awards dinner and individual prize giving where Josh was named in the NZ team to go to the World Champs later in the year.

Monday saw the start of the team's event, the women and men's team were seeded 3rd. Both the Men and women played at 9am, with the men playing Eastern and recording a 4/0 victory and the women also getting a 4/0 victory over Southern. Monday afternoon was the hard matches. The women played first against 2rd seeds BOP and recorded a 3/1 win putting them through to the final with wins coming from Amanda, Jackie and Paula.

The men played 4th seeds Canterbury in what we thought would be a tough tie but after losing the first match we bounced back to win 3/1 with wins from Josh, Ross and Kent.

Tuesday was finals day with the Women straight through to the final against Auckland and the men having two matches left against Auckland and Wellington. We had Auckland 1st and ended up losing 3/1 with Josh putting in excellent display to beat NZ National Champion Kashif Shuja.
