
Central Squash Life Member. Sadly passed away on 19th December 2015.

While I don't like to single out anyone person for their individual achievements I would like to say a big congratulations to our departing High Performance Manager Kent Darlington and his support crew for the magnificent work he has put in over the past 5 years and more. Kent has done a magnificent job creating a winning culture both on and off the court and set up a sustainable District Program as good as any of its kind around the world. On behalf of the committee I wish him all the very best for the future and I'm sure he'll remain in the game. I cannot go past thanking the many parents and partners we have involved in the sport. I thank you all for the support and time you give to the sport and the many tireless hours you give to your Clubs and children over the entire year, you all deserve a big pat on the back and there's nothing more satisfying than seeing our kids running around on the court enjoying themselves building lifelong friendships. The kids are our future and this is an area the District has identified as a key growth target for 2017. Junior squash is very prevalent throughout our District from the top level right through to the grass roots. What an awe-inspiring year to be involved with Squash Central! I highly recommend that you take the time to read through this years report, about the achievements of individual players, club teams and district representative teams throughout the year, Squash Central has had some amazing results! It has been a privilege to be involved with all the players, coaches and volunteers that I have met across the District this season while carrying out my role. I believe we are very fortunate and many clubs have some amazing, dedicated people working hard to keep our sport alive and growing throughout their towns. You are all doing an awesome job!

Squash Central has been involved in training staff and running successful Kiwi squash programmes in conjunction with Sport Wanganui in the Wanganui and Rangitikei areas and Sport Manawatu in Foxton and Levin. It is now hoped the these programmes will continue in the schools and help the clubs involved to grow their memberships. Because of the success of these we now hope to also include working with Sport Taranaki along the same lines in the upcoming year. The biggest highlight of my year has to be attending the Sport NZ Coach Developer Training programme. Thank you Luke Morriss at Squash NZ for making this possible. It was a very intense 3 days and nights, but the learning opportunities and network building were invaluable. Over the year I have also attended some of the Sport NZ follow up workshops. It is empowering to keep yourself up skilled, and I feel it is important as I can then come home and spread this knowledge learnt across the district with those people and clubs who are interested in our squash community. CoachForce has been extremely successful this year in Central. We recently featured on the Squash NZ website as one of their case studies on CoachForce, check it out! It is an interesting read. My role as CoachForce Officer was to up skill coaches by facilitating a range of engaging and informative learning activities that are supported with a resource pack for each module. I feel these were well received in the clubs that they were run in. Thank you Kaye Carter for your help in delivering some modules in the district over the season. Throughout the year we offered 13 Modules in Central. We had 75 coaches attend a module workshop this year and had 3 facilitating coach development opportunities. So get your committee thinking about your clubs focus and needs for the upcoming season and check out the 25 different modules on the SNZ website and make a plan with me for running them in your club next season! HIGH PERFORMANCE REPORT

Into our 5th season of our HP programme and again Squash Central has had another fantastic year of results from our HP players. The icing on the cake being our Senior Women taking out the NZ Team title for the 2nd time in 3 years and also the 2nd time ever in its 48 year history! We had superb results from our Senior Men's team and managed to get back the Newbigin Shield against Eastern, while also having our HP women players represent SquashGym and win the Mitchell Cup (NZ top Club Team competition). Again our program is really starting to have an effect of some results and depth, which in turn creates healthy competition amongst our players with many of them moving up the grading list.

This year's Zone Squad programme was a first also for those players situated underneath our top tier and we had regular One Day training sessions run out of Wanganui and Kawaroa Park which seemed to get a pass mark. By bringing this into our programme it enabled us to manage our numbers a lot better in both squads and also gave opportunities to players to be picked for the Senior One Day rep teams especially including those talented juniors coming through our ranks.

In brief a roundup of this year's events:

February saw us once again hold our annual **HP Squad Camp.** This was held at SquashGym over a weekend and it provided our management team a great start to the year, as it was easier to work with the reduced numbers. Some quality on and off court sessions were done along with player planning for the year.

The start of April saw our first One Day fixture, the **Newbigin Shield** clash against Eastern in Napier and the team managed to get revenge for the previous year. Both teams where without a number of top players and it really hindered Squash Eastern's lineup particularly. Central had a number of players on debut for the district, some of which were out of the newly established Zone Squads and they all competed well. Result: Central 17 - Eastern 7

In May we played our **One-Day fixture against Waikato** in Hamilton and unfortunately were well beaten as a number of our HP players were unavailable. Up against a powerful Waikato side on paper it told in the end. Central had some big battles, no more so in the morning round when we went down 9-3 in matches but as is always the case in these fixtures the five set matches become crucial to the overall score and this was evident as Central lost all 4 five setters in that 1st round. Again a number of players from the Zone Squad programme were exposed to some rep play. Result: Waikato 17 - Central 7.

Unfortunately the **Wairarapa Cup** between Central and Wellington did not go ahead this year due to time restraints.

We attended our **Central Open** as a **Squad Trip** in July and it is an important fixture that we will continue to support in our HP programme. It is our final selection tournament and team naming for the NZ Nationals and its great having our whole squad together where they are performing under pressure in front of management showing us they are worthy of selection.

It was then **NZ National** time in August where we travelled to the Remuera Club in Auckland. Individuals: This year we had only five of our players still going on finals day. Kashif Shuja (7th seed) won the Men's Open Plate and Kaitlyn Watts (9th seed) lost in the Women's Open Special Plate final. In the Men's Div 1 Ben Calvert (4th seed) took out the final, Stephen Bennett (8th seed) came 3rd and Nick Stretton (6th seed) won the Special Plate final.

Inter-district teams:

Again our Women's team stepped up to the plate delivering a top notch example of winning squash to become the NZ WOMENS TEAM CHAMPIONS for a 2nd time in 3 years by defeating top seeds Bay of Plenty 3-1 in the final after we were seeded 2nd. After winning it in 2014 for the first time when seeded 3rd, Central had to battle hard again along similar lines to topple the top teams. It certainly helped with the inclusion of Tamsyn Leevey (KP) at number two. Leevey who is a former top 24 player in the world and a commonwealth doubles silver medalist really provided strength and experience to the line-up.

This year's team line up of Danielle Fourie (SPN), Tamsyn Leevey (KP), Kaitlyn Watts (SPN), Holly Donnelly (SPN) and Rebecca Clifford (SPN) played fantastic squash and really performed when it mattered. The draw saw the six teams split into two pools of 3 and Central had to play Auckland the 3rd seeds first up. This match could have gone either way and really was a 50-50 match up on paper. However Central fired up and defeated Auckland in convincing fashion 4-0. Watts beat Priscilla Wildsmith 3/1 to start off, Leevey then beat Abbie Palmer 3/0 to go 2 nil up. Fourie then reversed the result from individuals and beat Ellie Epke 3/1 and Donnelly sealed the deal by winning against Anna Hughes 3/1. It was the same story then against Waikato (6th seeds), Central went to work with another 4-0 win, with Clifford swapping in at number four and reversing an earlier loss against Nicola Blake, this time winning 3/1.

Onto the final against Bay of Plenty and the Central team knew they would need to get off to a great start with Watts & Leevey the first 2 matches on. In a perfect situation the team needed them to win without dropping any sets just in case the back end of the tie went to a count back. No 3 Watts was up against Nadia Hubbard who she had never beaten after battling with her all last year for a spot in the NZ Junior World's team. The 15 year old was once again fantastic for her team & lead from the start winning in 3 sets 11/6, 11/4 and 11/6. Leevey then had to play the ever reliable Jo Shanks who had finished 6th in the individual draw and is a very tough customer. Once again she stepped up to the plate and put the team 2 nil up by winning 11/6, 13/11 and 11/4. On next was Fourie, Centrals no 1, who was up against it when she had to take on NZ Rep player Amanda Landers-Murphy. She was defeated 11/5, 11/2 and 11/7. This meant now that Central just needed 1 set to secure the tie if the last match was lost and it turned into a count back. On last was Donnelly against Aleisha Watene and she was looking in trouble at 5-0 down in the first set, however she pulled it back to win it 13-11, therefore sealing the deal and giving Central its 2nd title. Donnelly however didn't stop there and took out the match in 4 sets to clinch the clash 3 matches to 1 overall and be crowned the CHAMPIONS FOR 2016!

The Central Men's team of Kashif Shuja (SPN), Jason van der Walt (SPN), Ben Calvert (SPN), Stephen Bennett (SPN) and Nick Stretton (KP) were seeded 7th and also performed well above expectation. They pulled off the biggest upset in a number of years by knocking over 2nd seeds Waikato first round 3-1, something that is just unheard of in our sport. They then lost to Auckland 3-1 in the semi and Northland 2-1 to finish 4th overall after the last match wasn't played due to Northland having a lead in sets.

It was again unbelievable results for our Senior teams really, a proud day for CENTRAL to take the Women's title out in the fashion we did, only losing 1 match to a NZ Rep player throughout, showed that the women really took their chances when it mattered. Every one of the five had big matches all the way through at some stage and when you play well for yourself and your teammates it starts to create a belief through the team which becomes infectious. Danielle pulled off a big result against Ellie, Kaitlyn who is unbelievable for her age, showed determination beyond her years to beat Priscilla & Nadia, Tamsyn showed how experience counts in situations like this with great wins against Abbie & Jo, while Holly & Rebecca again stepped up to the mark for their teammates with superb wins.

Also the management group behind the team played a big part to the team's success. Grant Watts (SPN) who has been the coach of the girls team for a number of years fly's under the radar really, his calm influence on the team is second to none and certainly helps the girls, probably more than we all realise I think. His efforts have been huge over the last 5 years for our Central Senior programme. This year also we took a physio, Teresa Dixon from Intrinsic Performance and it really paid dividends for us as 8 matches over 5 days for the players is a huge task. Along with Coaches Kashif Shuja (SPN) & Sally Stantiall (RG) it really is a team effort that has proved to be a winning formula".

With this being my last year as HP Convenor and Senior Manager I'd like to express a huge thanks again to my team of Grant, Kashif, Sally, Teresa & Kaye. We all do our bit and every one of you is AWESOME! I'd also like to express my thanks to the Central Committee for supporting a vision I had when we started this programme up 5 years ago where winning titles was the goal, we have tasted some success now and I'm pretty certain we can win more in the years to come. To all the players, huge thanks also for your commitment and hopefully you have enjoyed it as much as I have. I'm hugely proud to be a part of Central and of the things we have achieved of late and wish everyone involved in the years to come more winning success!

FINANCIAL REPORT

I took over from Rob in May of this year, some very big shoes to fill! This has been a learning curve for me but we have managed to get through the year.

I am pleased to report a profit of \$5,311 with affliation fees and grants and donations again our main forms of income. Grants were received from Pub Charity, NZ Racing Board, Mainland Foundation, COGS, ECCT, NZCT, Inifinity Foundation and Lion Foundation, we thank them for their continued support.

Income is down 8,000 on last year due to affiliation fees being less - maybe something we need to work on with clubs in 2017 to help increase their memberships. Funding and sponsorships are also down on last year. Expenditure is down \$9,500 on last year. We spent less on coaching this year, a planning meeting set down for early next year will undoubtedly be looking at increasing this in 2017 with a focus on getting more coaching into our clubs. Rep team expenses are down too; this is mainly due to the Masters team paying much of their own way to play in Dunedin.

Funding of \$4,686.30 we received from Sport Taranaki in 2014 for coaching in the Taranaki was never used and had to be returned this year.

We have a \$30,000 term deposit with the BNZ and still hold a \$10,000 debenture with Squashgym.

I would like to thank Rob Brownrigg for his help handing this daunting job over to me and Pauline Slovak for all her help and support (and often pointing me in the right direction!!) this year.



1. SPECIFIC ACCOUNTING POLICIES The following specific accounting policies which materially affect the measurement of financial performance and the financial position have been applied. REVENUE Affiliation and competition income is recorded once an invoice has been raised. Grants, donations and interest are recorded when they are received unless there is a condition attached in which case it is recognised as a liability until it is spent ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE Accounts receivable are stated at their net realisable value. CLOTHING ON HAND

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, ou a first in-first out basis.

FIXED ASSETS All fixed assets are recorded at cost less accumulated depreciation to date. Depreciation has been provided at the maximum rates permitted by the Income Tax Act 1994

INCOME TAX The society is exempt from income tax as an amateur sports body under Section CW 46 of the Income Tax Act 2007

CONDITIONAL GRANTS Grants received are recognised as income unless the specific conditions attached to them are not met. In these cases the grants are shown as a liability until the conditions are met

GOODS AND SERVICES TAX The financial statements have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis with the exception of accounts receivable and accounts payable which are shown GST inclusive

DEBENTURE The Debenture issued to Squashgym Palmerston North is stated at cost
