On an individual note Kaitlyn Watts represented NZ at the World Junior Champs playing for NZ in the number 1 position, Reece Holmes won the North, South and NZ U/11 champs, Anabel Romero won the U/11 NZ champs, Courtney Trail (A) / Sarah Ratcliffe (C) / Eddy Henry (F) / Gina Bailey (B) won their grades at the National Champions of Champions. To top it off Anabel, Reece and Brooke Reid were all selected for NZ Junior training squads. Hawera D grade women also claimed the National Super Champs title for their grade.

We continue to run many interclub divisions throughout the year as well as having strong representation at the District and national level when it comes to Superchamps including an upsurge of people attending and playing District tournaments. I note there has been a number of new people joining the sport hopefully resulting in similar trend moving in to the 2018 season.

In closing this will be my last term in the Presidents role. My sole focus going forward will be on the coaching side of the sport. Thank you to all for your support over the past couple of years and I look forward to working closely with many of you in the upcoming months.

DEVELOPMENT MANAGER / DISTRICT COACH REPORT

The focus when I took on the role of District Coach was to let all Clubs in the District know that we have a District Coach in place to offer them help / support in a coaching capacity focusing on: coaching of coach education, offering coaching clinics to members, supporting & assisting with any club programs they have in place e.g. juniors & putting squad camps in place for our 9 to 13 year olds as well as junior players from E through to C grade & delivering our inaugural District coaching conference. On the whole I focused on communicating with & travelling to as many Clubs as possible to ensure they were all offered the exact same opportunities as all other Clubs in the District.

All of the above has been achieved apart from the Coaching Conference which we are looking at running at the start of the 2018 season so coaches can deliver what they have learned throughout the season.

I came in to the role in an interim capacity & it has shown me first hand that it is critical for our District to have a District Coach in place that travels far & wide servicing, meeting & liaising with as many clubs as possible in the Region. It's been a very hectic 3 months with many a mile clocked up on the road & it's been invaluable physically travelling to all of the clubs in the Region bar a couple, and communicating with every single one.

This has shown me there is significant demand in the District for quality coaching, that we as a District need to lead the coaching delivery through a District Coach, there is an abundance of talent coming through the ranks that's spread out around the entire area that in the past has not had the opportunity to be involved in professional, consistent & regular training programs or coaching unless they travelled to venues, the general feedback has been that it's excellent to see a professional service come to their Clubs. It has really opened my eyes & I'm convinced that we need to prioritise to continue this role from early 2018 for the simple fact of developing all of the talent that's in the entire District offering all players of all levels the opportunity to learn & improve & mentoring club coaches to deliver quality programs. On top of this I've been blown away by some of the Clubs & their junior programs & coaches, whilst we are challenged with attracting volunteers there are many great ones in our District that are doing some fantastic stuff, our club coaches which we have an abundance of & who are doing a fantastic job!

The District Coaching contract finishes in mid-October & dependent on funding moving in to 2018 the ground work that has been done & the key relationships that have been developed over the past 3 months need to be built upon to ensure we are continuing to improve the coaching delivery throughout the entire District both to our players, coaches & budding coaches.

ELITE SQUAD REPORT

After 5 years of Kent running a very successful High Performance programme, we found ourselves with a good base of players to approach 2017 with. We knew this year would be a bit of a rebuilding year, and introducing some new players to the rep programme and getting the best out of some of the older ones was going to be very important. With losing Kent as our leader, and having a number of our top players unavailable at different times throughout the season, this was going to be good chance to see how good our depth was – and it proved to be pretty good.

Our first challenge was against Waikato in early April. This is normally played with 6 Ladies and 6 men, but as Waikato were struggling to find enough ladies, we agreed to cut it down to 4 ladies and 6 men. We knew this would probably go against us as our ladies were very strong, but we all felt it was better to do this to ensure the fixture went ahead. So we turned up in Ohakune with a reasonably strong ladies team, and very much a young but keen men's team. All the players fought hard, and at the end of the day we went down 11 matches to 9 - a pretty good result considering the young team we sent – with 7 of the 10 players still in the junior ranks (Corbin Faint, Dylan Budge, Richard Bell and Jordan Bell for the men - Kaitlyn Watts, Annaleise Faint and Gina Bailey for the ladies), and 2 others (Allan Bailey and Brandon Keenan) only just out of the juniors. Di Tasker was the master of the team who obviously decided that this early in the season she needed lots of time on court – so played 2 x 5 setters - winning against Jaimee Hunt, but losing to Paige Brown. Great results by our ladies with Kaitlyn winning both of her matches, (and moving into A1 with these wins), and Gina Bailey also playing superb squash to win both her matches against Jamiee and Paige. Annalesie Faint played well to beat Amber Hern, and put up a great fight, losing against higher seeded Nadine Cull. Solid start to the season, it's never good losing 11/9, but with having lost 2 x 5 setters it showed how close it was winning both of those we would have beaten a team that was much stronger than us on paper.

With SNZ making the decision to split the Senior National into 2 separate events individuals and teams, we only had a few of our players go to Hawkes Bay for the Individuals – and again they were all juniors. Corbin Faint (seeded 29th) played in the Mens Open, facing 4th seed and NZ representative Lance Beddoes in the 1st round. He lost to Lance and made it to the 2nd round of the plate before losing to Quinn Udy. Jordan Bell and Richard Bell were in the Mens Div 1, with Richard (seeded 11th) losing first round but going on to win the plate (finishing 9th), and Jordan (seeded 9th) beating the top seed in the 2nd round in a tough 5 setter, and then finishing a very credible 4th place. We also had Courtney Trail (13th seed) and Kaitlyn Watts (4th seed) in the Womens Open. Both made it safely through the first round – and then had to play each other! Kaitlyn managed to beat Courtney, with Courtney then going on to finish in the top 12 in NZ by beating Casey Owen 11/9 in the 5th - well done Courtney. Kaitlyn went on to beat Jo Shanks to make the semi's and consolidate her position as one of the top players in NZ outside the professional players. She then lost to Joelle King in the semi's and Amanda Landers Murphy in the 3/4th playoff.

In Mid August we travelled back to Hawkes Bay as a team to play in the National Teams. Many masters players had returned to the event due to this split, as well as many younger players who do not play a lot of squash these days and find it too tough to play 8/9 games over a week, but can manage 2/3 games over a weekend in a team's event. Our Men's team was seeded 8th (Jason van der Walt, Corbin Faint, Nick Stretton, Brandon Keenan, and Allan Bailey), and met top seeds Wellington in the 1st round. Corbin Faint put a spanner in the works by beating higher seeded Sam

Atkins in 5, but the team went down 3/1. They then lost 3/1 to Waikato, and 3/1 to Eastern with Nick Stretton beating past CD stalwart Joseph Watts. The young team did well, and were a credit to Central with the attitude they showed and the fight they put into every match. The girls were seeded 3rd (Kaitlyn Watts, Danielle Fourie, Courtney Trail, Jackie Tapp and Annaleise Faint). They beat Northland 4/0, and went on to play 2nd seeds Ak in the semi. They played well, with matches shared 2/2, but eventually lost 6/7 on games countback. Tough way to lose, but they finished with a 4/0 win over Wtgn in the playoff to finish 3rd, but oh so close to making the final.

The last event on the CD calendar was the Newbigin Challenge with Eastern in early September. This was a notable occasion for a number of reasons – but mainly for the return of Kent Darlington to the ranks of "player". It was also great to have more senior players than juniors in the team, with Kent, Brandon Keenan, Allan Bailey and Daniel Foster joining our 2 juniors Corbin Faint and Jordan Bell in the men's team, and Kaye Carter, Di Tasker and Danielle Fourie joining our 3 juniors Kaitlyn Watts, Courtney Trail and Annaleise Faint in the women's team. Kent played well for his first Central hit out, playing well but losing against top Eastern player Cameron Jamieson, but then winning his afternoon game to give CD a point. Central eventually proved too strong for Eastern winning the tie 14/10, with Allan Bailey, Brandon Keenan, Danielle Fourie, Courtney Trail and Kaitlyn Watts all winning both their matches. It was a great finish to the Central representative calendar to win the Newbigin Shield for another season.

It has been a privilege to have been involved with the Central Senior teams this season. The support our squads receive from the Central committee has ensured we gained some credible results despite not always having our best players available. The addition of Teresa Dixon from Intrinsic Performance was again invaluable and went a long way to ensuring we had players able to play to the best of their ability at all times. Her addition to the team for a second year certainly helped with our junior girls who went on and won the Junior Girls District title – with many of them playing 8 matches over 6 days.

Thank you to all the players who made themselves available and always gave your all for the District. These fixtures are vital for the District and players, and it's great we can always field a team, and continue to build experience amongst our players at this high level.

Main problem this year was tournament results not being entered correctly, if the module kicks you out, DON'T go and re-enter, GO to PENDING RESULTS and find, then continue, saves a lot of work for all.

The Interclub module is also now easier and more user friendly. The captains just need to be more awake sometimes when entering results, maybe leave until the next day to enter. Sorry just trying to cut down on my work.

The Eastern vs Central challenge was held at the Hastings Squash this year. Another well ran challenge with some great squash being played. Unfortunately Central lost 23-17, it was great to have players from all over the district.

NZ Junior Nationals

The boys started on Sunday night against top seeds Auckland. All our boys found themselves up against players who were ranked over 1000 points ahead of themselves, but you would not have known that from the way they played. We rested Corbin Faint, but the team of Jordan Bell, Dylan Budge, George Mikkelsen and Matt Adshead, all played amazing squash to make the Aucklanders work hard for every point. We lost 4/0, but gained a lot of respect from the Auckland players and coaches for the positive way they played, and the amount of pressure they put in the much higher ranked opponents. This theme continued throughout the tournament, with the boys continuing to ignore their seeding, and learning that your seeding only matters if you let it. They finished well with a good win against Wellington.

The girls started on Monday, and had to play 3 matches at 9, 12, and 6pm. They dominated the day with Kaitlyn Watts, Courtney Trail, and Annaleise Faint playing all the matches, and Tia Pauro, and Genevieve Bell sharing the No 4 spot. With 3 strong wins on the Monday, we had a easier day on Tuesday with only 1 game at 6pm. This was meant to be the "semi final" of the pool against 4th seeded Eastern, and was going to be a very close tie. But unfortunately their No 2 player injured herself before the match so was unable to play. This did not help Eastern and our girls were able to play well to win 3/1, and put themselves into the final against 2nd seeds Waikato the next morning.

If you are going to win a final, you need to start well, and Annaleise was just the girl to give us that momentum. She went on against Sophie Hodges and dominated the T, pushing her opponent all over the court, winning in 3. Fantastic start, just what we needed. Tia was on next, and after throwing up after yesterday's game, her job was just to win as many points as she could, and maybe a game. She played amazing squash putting her body through hell to squeeze heaps of points, and even got us a game - more than we could have asked of her. She lost 3/1, but that 1 game put heaps of pressure on the Waikato No1 Anika Jackson who now had to find a way to win, or at least get a couple of games off our #1 Kaitlyn Watts. The momentum started by Annaleise, and continued by Tia inspired Kaitlyn, and she dominated Anika, winning the first game 11/2. She eventually won in 4 giving Courtney the task of finishing off the tie against most improved player Georgia Robcke. Courtney was on fire, dominating the game and never giving her opponent a chance for an upset win, winning 3/0, and winning the title of District Champions for the first time since 2005. Well done to both teams, and thanks must go to Teresa for making sure our players were fit and healthy, and ready to play in the teams event. Many of these players had to play 8/9 matches over 6 days, and Teresa had to work overtime to get them back on the court each day in good order to play well. Thank you to the two coaches, Grant Watts and Jason Fletcher you both did an amazing job.

FINANCIAL REPORT

It has been another busy year for Squash Central and as the financial statements show there was an excess expenditure over income resulting in a small loss this year. This was mainly due to grants, donations and sponsorships not being as high as expected. Expenditure was down also, mainly in the rep team expenses and coaching areas.

Our funders this year were: Pub Charity, Lion Foundation, NZCT, ECCT, Mainland Foundation and NZ Racing Board, we thank them for their ongoing support and Pauline for her tireless efforts in obtaining this funding.


This year we have invested \$10,000 with TSB Bank. We still have a \$10,000 debenture with Squashgym and we have a \$45,000 term deposit with the BNZ. The total funds employed have increased by \$3,708 to \$104,811.

I have budgeted for more funds to be spent on coaching next year as we see this as a key area where Squash Central can support the clubs. In my opinion we could be helping clubs with getting better referees too, but this is something for the incoming committee to decide.

During the season we made the decision to financially back our Champion of Champions National team. We liked the idea of supporting players from a good cross section of clubs and grades. This made it even more satisfying when they won.

Once again Pauline has been invaluable with all the work she takes on, we have a good working relationship and I thank her for everything she does over and above what she gets paid for.

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Central Squash Association (Incorporated) is an incorporated society, registered under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with a special purpose framework for the benefit of the members

These financial statements do not include the activities or balances of the Central Squash Trust

MEASUREMENT BASE

The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of earnings and financial position on a historical basis are followed by the entity.

SPECIFIC ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following specific accounting policies which materially affect the measurement of financial performance and the financial position have been applied.

REVENUE

Affiliation and competition income is recorded once an invoice has been raised. Grants, donations and interest are recorded when they are received unless there is a condition attached in which case it is recognised as a liability until it is spent

ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE

Accounts receivable are stated at their net realisable value.

CLOTHING ON HAND

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, on a first in-first out basis.

FIXED ASSETS

All fixed assets are recorded at cost less accumulated depreciation to date. Depreciation has been provided at the maximum rates permitted by the Income Tax Act 1994

INCOME TAX

The society is exempt from income tax as an amateur sports body under Section CW 46 of the Income Tax Act 2007

CONDITIONAL GRANTS

Grants received are recognised as income unless the specific conditions attached to them are not met. In these cases the grants are shown as a liability until the conditions are met

GOODS AND SERVICES TAX

The financial statements have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis with the exception of accounts receivable and accounts payable which are shown GST inclusive

DEBENTURE

The Debenture issued to Squashgym Palmerston North is stated at cost

NETTING OFF

INDEPENDENT ASSURANCE PRACTITIONER'S REVIEW REPORT

TO THE MEMBERS OF CENTRAL SQUASH ASSOCIATION (INCORPORATED)

Report on the Special Purpose Financial Statements

We have reviewed the accompanying special purpose financial statements of Central Squash Association (Incorporated), which comprise the statement of financial position as at 30 September 2017, and the statement of financial performance and statement of movement in general funds for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Committee's Responsibility for the Special Purpose Financial Statements

The Committee is responsible for the preparation of these special purpose financial statements in accordance with the Accounting Policies of the Association and for such internal control as the Committee determines is necessary to enable the preparation of the financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Assurance Practitioner's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on the accompanying special purpose financial statements. We conducted our review in accordance with International Standard on Review Engagements (New Zealand) (ISRE (NZ)) 2400, Review of Historical Financial Statements Performed by an Assurance Practitioner who is not the Auditor of the Entity. ISRE (NZ) 2400 requires us to conclude whether anything has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the special purpose financial statements, taken as a whole, are not prepared in all material respects in accordance with the Accounting Policies of the Association. This Standard also requires us to comply with relevant ethical requirements.

A review of special purpose financial statements in accordance with ISRE (NZ) 2400 is a limited assurance engagement. The assurance practitioner performs procedures, primarily consisting of making enquiries of management and others within the entity, as appropriate, and applying analytical procedures, and evaluates the evidence obtained. The procedures performed in a review are substantially less than those performed in an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (New Zealand). Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion on these special purpose financial statements. Other than in our capacity as assurance practitioner we have no relationship with, or interests in, Central Squash Association (Incorporated).

Basis for Qualified Conclusion

Control over income other than affiliation fees, grants and interest, prior to being recorded is limited and there are no practical assurance procedures to determine the effect of these limited control. Consequently, we were unable to determine whether any adjustments to these amounts were necessary.

Qualified Conclusion

Based on our review, except for the effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Conclusion paragraph, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the special purpose financial statements of Central Squash Association (Incorporated) as at 30 September 2017, and its financial performance for the year then ended, are not prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with the Accounting Policies of the Association.





Emphasis of Matter

Without modifying our conclusion, we draw attention to statement of accounting policies, which describes the basis of accounting. These are special purpose financial statements and have been prepared to meet the requirements of the members. As a result, the financial statements may not be suitable for another purpose. Our conclusion not qualified in respect of this matter.

Restriction on Responsibility

This report is made solely to the Members, as a body. Our review work has been undertaken so that we might state to the committee those matters we are required to state to them in a reviewer's report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, we do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the members as a body, for our review work, for this report, or for the conclusions we have formed.
